GRADIENT FLOWER PLACEMAT

This sturdy placemat uses an embroidery design created in Artistic Digitizer to show you it's creative ability. From the gorgeous gradient flowers to the quilting in the hoop, you can watch your project come to life as you make one for yourself! Katie's detailed tutorial will walk you through the project from beginning to end. She loves designing in Artistic Digitizer and creating projects that expand your creative knowledge.



Supplies for One Placemat:

Right Panel:

13" x 13" Top Main Fabric 13" x 13" Cut Away Embroidery Stabilizer 13" x 13" Quilt Batting

Left Embroidered Panel:

7" x 14" Solid Fabric
7" x 14" SF101 or similar medium weight Interfacing
7"x14" Quilt Batting
Cut Away stabilizer to fit the RE46D Hoop (11"x18")

Backing:

17" x 12" Backing Fabric 17" x 12" Fusible Fleece 17" x 12" Double-Sided Fusible Web

Binding:

Two 2.25" strips cut width of fabric

Color Chart Stitch Order:

Use your personal choice of colors to coordinate with your décor. The colors listed stitch out in the following order:

Color 1 – Placement stitch of quilt sandwich

Color 2 – Tack down stitch for quilt sandwich

Color 3 - Grid Quilting

Color 4 – First gradient color

Color 5 – Second gradient color


Color 6 – Satin Stitch petals

Color 7 - Flower Center

Color 8 – Marking line for guided panel cutting (includes little square marking the right side of panel)

Before you begin:

1. After cutting your 13" x 13" Right Panel, fold each side from the center, matching the raw edges, and place a notch to denote the center of each side of the square. This will help with accurate cutting and squaring up of your panel once it's been quilted.



- 2. Follow along with the online tutorial for detailed instructions on how to set up your quilt sandwich.
- 3. Have fun with your fabric choices and thread colors. You have creative license to quilt this any way you like. For a "homey feel", try piecing a patchwork block that you can cut down to size. For an "elegant feel", try quilting on silk dupioni or linen.
- 4. Future ideas: You can break the embroidery design apart and make a small mug rug to coordinate with your placemat. Again, just have fun!
