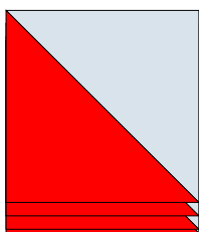
American Pie with Spoon Block Placemats



5" F HST
4 deep blue

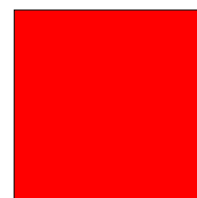
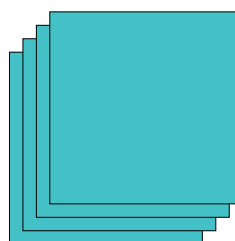


5" F QST
4 sky blue
4 gray or white



2.5" F HST

- 4 red
- 4 gray or white



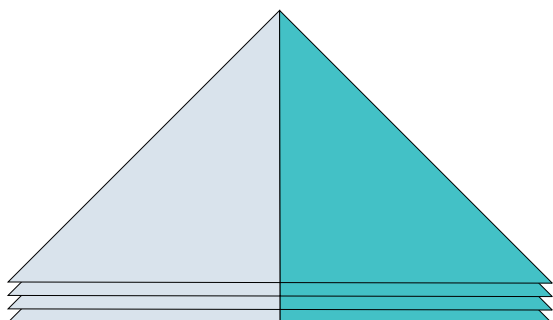
3" Square

- 4 teal blue
- 1 red

In addition to the pieces above, you will also need the following rectangles: two deep blue pieces 1"x13", two red pieces 1.5"x 13" and one deep blue rectangle at 3"x13" to complete each placemat. Multiple the units by how many placemats are desired.

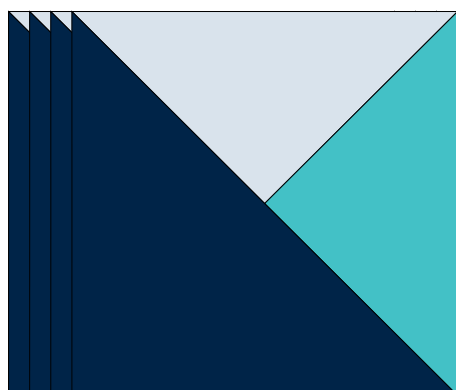
Each placemat requires approximately 65" of binding in your desired width. This is just under 7 WOF strips to make 4 placemats or just under 2 strips to make a single placemat.

American Pie with Spoon Block Placemats



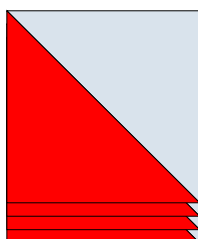
Step 1:

Stitch the sky blue and gray 5”F QST units together on the shorter sides of the triangles to make 4 larger size, two tone triangles per placemat. Blue should be on the right side as shown. Press this seam open.



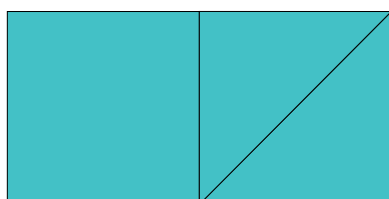
Step 2:

Join the units from Step 1 with the 5”F HST triangles to make four units as shown. Press this seam open. Make 4 per placemat.



Step 3:

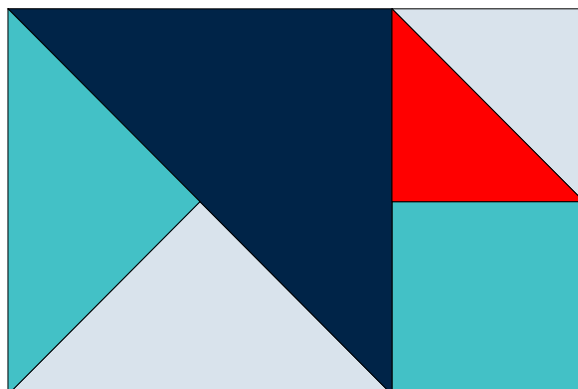
Join the 2.5”F HST triangles to make 4 two tone HST units as shown. Press this seam open. Make 4 per placemat.



Step 4:

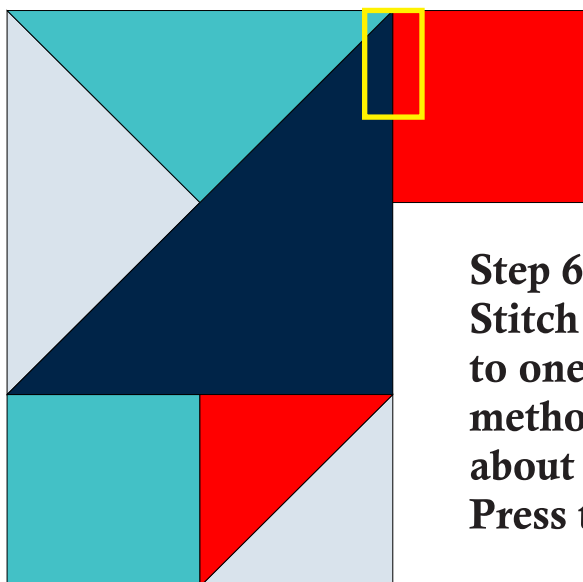
Join the 3” sky blue squares to the 2.5”F HST squares. Make sure the gray is on the outside of the unit as shown. Press seams towards the light blue. Make 4 per placemat.

Step 5:

Stitch the two patch unit from Step 4 to the completed units from Step 2. Press this seam open. Make 4.



Step 6:

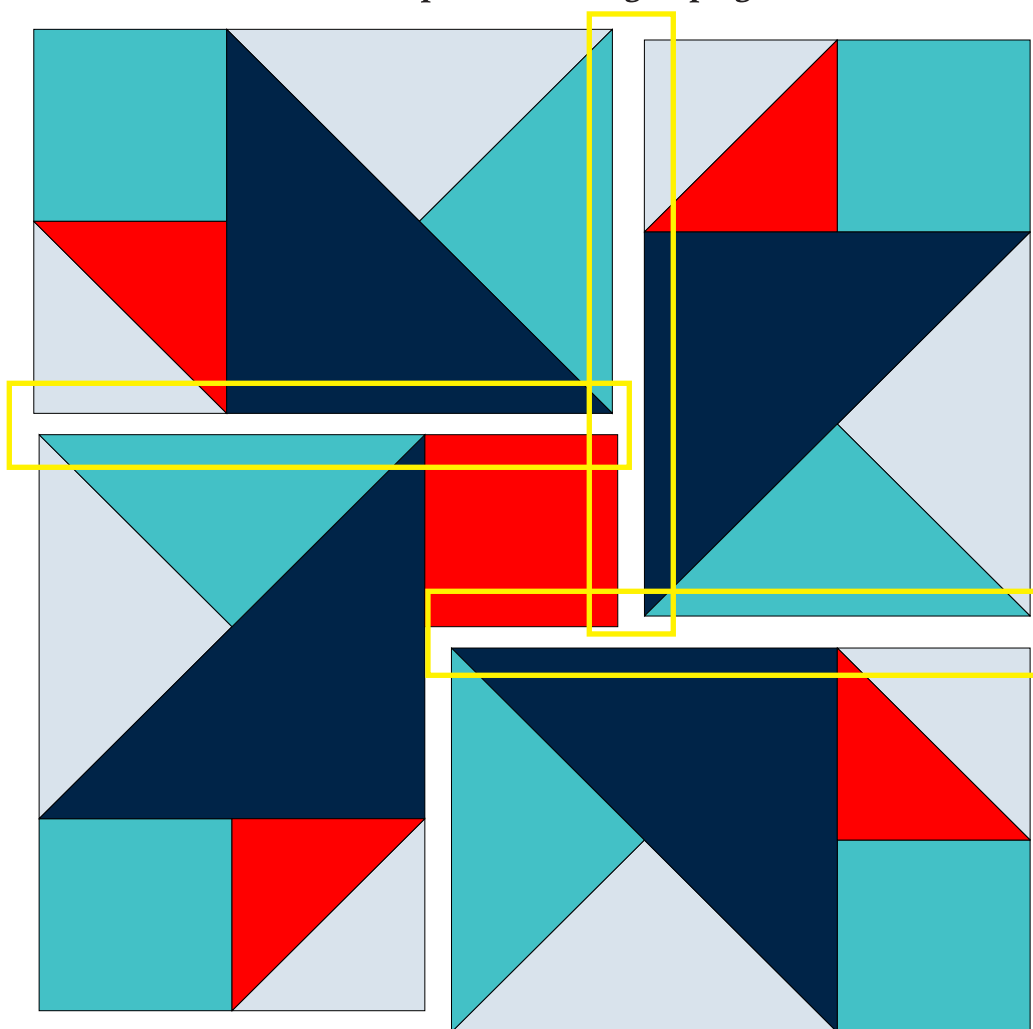
Stitch a short seam to join the center 3" square to one Step 5 unit. This is a partial seam method. Do not stitch the entire seam but only about halfway as shown by the yellow box. Press this seam open.

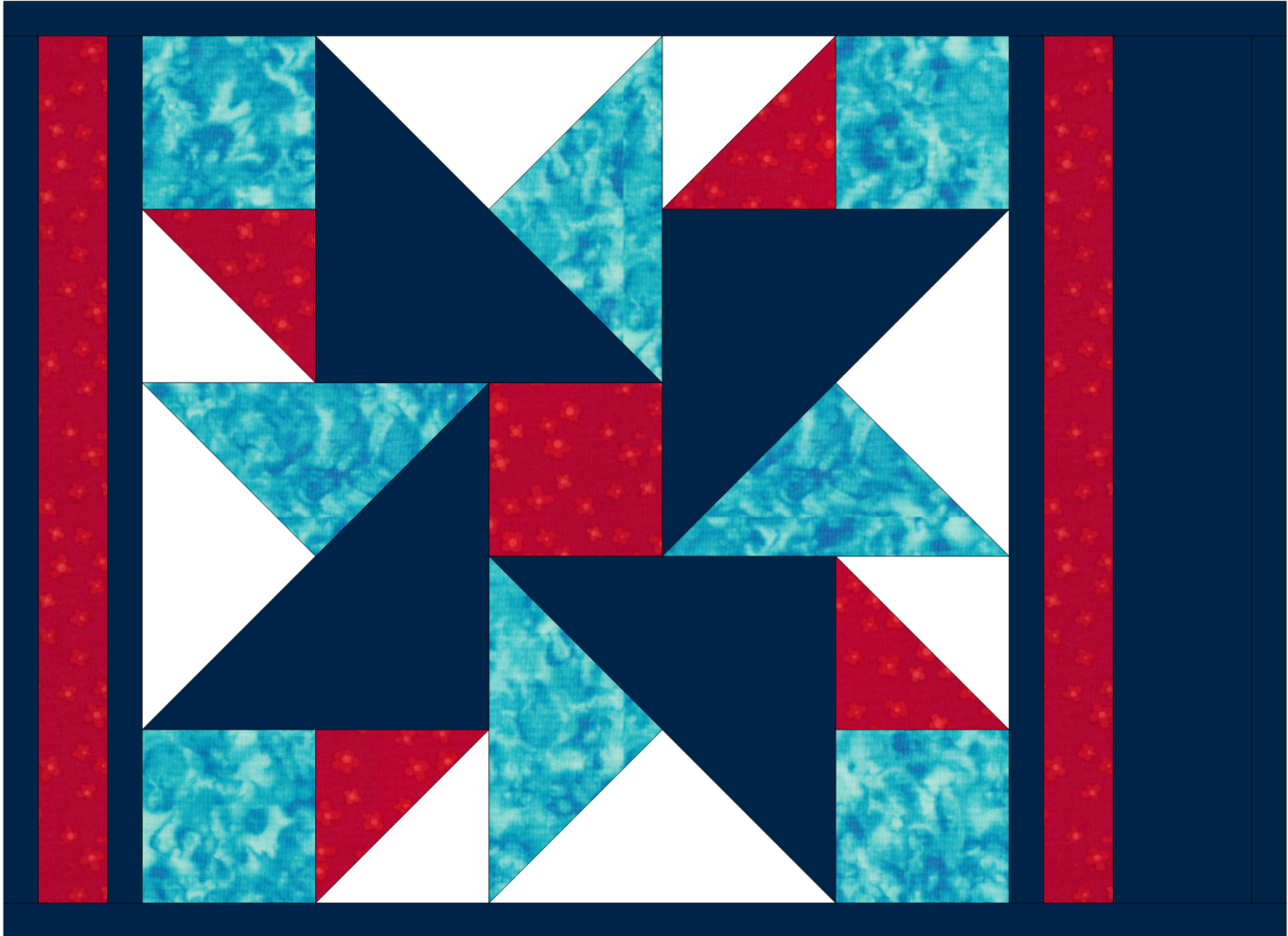


Unit 7C.

Step 7:

This step requires adding pieces in a specific order. They are label A, B, and C and shown above. Add a Step 5 unit to the unit from Step 6. This is noted as 7A. See the 7A note above. Once 7A is completed, add another Step 5 Unit. This is noted as 7B. Then add the last Step 5 unit as shown at 7C. After 7C is stitched to the red center square, you can complete the initial partial seam and the block will be finished. Press each seam as a unit is added and press all seams open for best results.

Step 8:

Stitch a deep blue 1"x13" rectangle to opposite sides of the block from Step 7 as shown. Then add the red 1.5"x13" rectangle to the right and left sides of the placemat. Finally add the 3"x13" deep blue rectangle to the right side of the placemat to create a space for silverware. Press all seams toward the deep blue for these areas. Quilt as desired, the bind. Suitable for embroidered quilting, rulerwork, or freemotion or all in combination.
